Experiential education can be broadly defined as including field trips, outdoor education, adventure education, outdoor recreation, and athletic trips. This session will discuss current standards and issues related to experiential education activities in the college and university setting. Topics include standards of care, risk management responsibilities and strategies, incident management, post-incident management, accident dynamics, and real-world cases. The facilitator has managed seven separate post-secondary student fatality events and will talk about lessons learned in these incidents.

Ross Cloutier is the founder of the Adventure Programs Department at Thompson Rivers University (TRU) in Kamloops, British Columbia. He is also the owner of Bhudak Consultants Ltd. (which specializes in providing experiential education risk management services to schools, businesses and governments), and is a partner in Pinnacle Risk and Insurance Consultants Inc. (which provides adventure tourism risk assessment services to insurers around the world).

Ross has conducted a large number of education-related program reviews and accident investigations, including the accident investigation into the Roger's Pass avalanche for Strathcona-Tweedsmuir School.

As a mountain guide, Ross has led journeys to over 30 countries. He was the climbing leader of the Everest Canada 1991 expedition. Ross has studied Outdoor Recreation and Outdoor Education, and holds an MBA in International Business.
